

# Residential Treatment

Focus is on development of social responsibility through interaction in a group setting as well as in the public school setting, self-worth and self-confidence (focusing on addressing competencies and strengths, involvement in church or faith based activities, band, chorus, sports, and other activities encouraged and supported), and development of a strong work ethic (as applicable). Residents will be provided (behavioral health) therapy and counseling through a Master level therapist with HSPP supervision, and billed through Medicaid as eligible and as applicable via referral by placing agency.

- Admission via initial pre-placement interview or through transition from emergency care to residential treatment
- Ages 6-19, males/females; safe rural community setting, home like environment conducive to flexibility in meeting individual needs of youth
- Staff ratio is 1-6
- Services available during placement:
  - CANS, GAF, Family Risk Scale, Family Problem Checklist
  - Case Management, includes service coordination, transportation to court, and monthly reporting
  - Education in a public school setting, includes participation in school – related activities
  - Participation and involvement in faith based activities, includes church, vacation bible school, and youth groups if client wish to do so
  - Recreation provided daily through child care workers on duty
  - Tutoring supervised by certified teacher(s) Sunday through Thursday to assist with homework and to follow up on assigned homework through Chapter 1 funding

The following services may be Medicaid billable if resident is eligible and if service is requested by referring agency: Sex Offender Treatment, Substance Abuse, Parent Education, Individual Therapy, Family Therapy, Group Therapy
