

B.A.S.E

Eligible Clients:

- Program is set up through contracts with individual schools
- At-risk students

Behavioral, Academic, and Social Education (B.A.S.E.) - This program targets youth in Randolph County grades 7-12 who have struggled behaviorally, academically, or socially in the public school. Each of the five school corporations located in Randolph County are able to refer a limited number of youth to the B.A.S.E. program. All five school corporations allow for B.A.S.E. students to earn equivalent academic credits which are accepted by each of the schools. The focus of the B.A.S.E. program is for youth to increase conflict resolution skills, increase awareness and implementation of self-control and self-confidence and increase effective coping skills. B.A.S.E. youth also develop specific life skills (Examples: increase knowledge of money management, develop healthier hygiene routines, learn ways to obtain and maintain employment, and youth are also taught safe ways to cook and clean). Each youth who attends B.A.S.E. is given 30 minutes or more of individual counseling each week with a bachelor's level YSB staff member. The B.A.S.E. Counselor is there to attend community outings and volunteer experiences with the youth within the community, lead group counseling sessions as requested or needed, and fill in to implement the B.A.S.E. program and complete tasks needed. The YSB B.A.S.E. Counselor is also in the classroom 20 hours or more per week. The B.A.S.E. classroom is presently equipped to accommodate up to 10 youth but the program has potential to further expand.

Services Include:

- Individualized counseling
- Mentoring
- Family Involvement
- Classroom assistance focusing on appropriate behaviors
